

Troubleshooting Leaking

We haven't met a leak we couldn't fix with this check-list. Most leaks are simply from setups that need some tweaking.

- 1. Puncture Hole For groundsheet, dry area and apply patch (try Gear Aide). For canvas, dry and apply canvas patch. Need help with a repair? Give us a call.
- 2. Roof not extending over sidewalls: Correct rope tension around tent, to ensure that the sides of the tent are sheltered by the roof.
- 3. Groundsheet not up 4 inches on sides of tent to create tub effect: Correct setup, with special attention to groundsheet stakes and ties.
- 4. Groundsheet and door zippers not covered by flaps: Correct by pulling canvas flaps down over zippers.



Troubleshooting Continued

- Window Zippers: Need to meet at top of flap.
- Tent Zippers at front corners: need to be clipped in and bottom groundsheet needs to be tucked in and up, cover with flap.
- Wind, driving rain up and into vents at top of tent: Extreme weather, some dripping occurs.
- Plastic rain cap: Needs to be on top of porch nipple/grommet.

Normal Wear

After about 5000 hours of exposure (depending on the environment), you may start to notice that water isn't pooling up on the exterior of the tent, as it should. It may be time to re-apply a water proofing agent.
