



SNOW LOAD TIPS

Wet Snow = Heavy Snow

- Wet snow can be up to 3x as heavy as dry powdery snow, so make sure you evaluate your snow load accurately and work to keep it off your tent.
- 3-4 in of wet snow can be heavy enough to cause your center pole to buckle.
- No more than 12 in of snow should accumulate next to your tent sidewalls.

Center Pole

- Holds up to 600 lbs in addition to the weight of your tent.
- Folds into three sections
- Designed to collapse under excess weight in order to prevent canvas from tearing
- Despite collapseable design, canvas CAN rip/ tear.
